## Nebraska Healthy Kids Summit (Virtual)

March 3-4, 2021

Children's is excited to facilitate the second annual Nebraska Healthy Kids Summit in March 2021. This summit is being presented in collaboration with the Nebraska Department of Education's Healthy Schools Program.

The goal of this year's summit is to explore the impact of the global pandemic and systemic inequities on child nutrition and active living in Nebraska communities, while connecting stakeholders through research, practice, and advocacy approaches that promote equitable child health in a call to action.

## Project ECHO: Addressing Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) in the School Health Office

Starting January 2021

School nurses are invited to join in Children's next Project ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) series. Learning sessions will explore SDOH topics to improving participant knowledge regarding evaluating and assisting with student and family SDOH struggles and concerns.
